3D Europe Project

After studying the political boundaries and physical features of Europe, its time to put your knowledge to work. You are going to create a three dimensional (3D) map of Europe. There are several options and many possibilities, but you must fulfill all requirements to receive full credit.



Requirements

- 1. Your map must be no larger 14 inches by 22 inches (a half sheet of posterboard).
- 2. Your map must be three dimensional. Build the mountains! Dig the rivers! Show the features as best you can. Use cardboard, styrofoam, play-doh, clay, Lego... Whatever you want. At the very minimum, use different textures and colors (like construction paper, paint or glitter to show the features.
- 3. You may either create a full map of Europe or you can focus on one physical feature of the continent.
- 4. Your map should show all the political boundaries and other physical features we have studied within the area you choose. For example, if you chose The Alps, you would show the mountains, the nations of France, Germany and Italy, plus the Rhine River and perhaps the Mediterranean Sea. If you chose The English Channel, you'd show United Kingdom, France, Belgium, European Plain, and perhaps the Iberian Peninsula, Rhine River or Germany.
