# Australia Project

Create a poster, pamphlet, booklet or essay containing six different topics from our study of Australia.

#### 1. <u>Culture</u> (choose three)

- Language: Discuss the major languages spoken in Australia.
- <u>Customs:</u> Tell us about some traditions of the Australian people What do they celebrate? How do they celebrate?
- Holidays: Choose at least two commonly celebrated in Australia and tell about/discuss them.
- <u>Dress / Clothing:</u> What are <u>traditional</u> or cultural clothing styles of Australian people? Include the dress or clothing of people living in major cities (Sydney, Melbourne, etc.) and the Outback.
- <u>Food:</u> Are there certain Australian foods that are common or considered a delicacy something that Australia is known for?

#### 2. <u>Government</u> (all)

- <u>Population:</u> How many people live in Australia?
- <u>Government:</u> What type of government does Australia have? Who is in charge? How do citizens participate?
- Commonwealth of Nations: What is it? How does it affect Australia?
- Flag: Recreate the Australia flag

## 3. Geography (all)

- <u>Map:</u> Draw or print a map of Australia and label it.
- <u>Climate</u>: Describe the climate of Australia.
- <u>Major Physical Features</u>: Label the physical features on your map (such as labeling mountains, rivers, canyons... Australian features!). Include: The Great Barrier Reef, Coral Sea, Ayers Rock, and the Great Victoria Desert. A key must be included with your map.
- <u>Major Political Features:</u> Label the six states, two territories, and major cities on your map.

## 4. Economics (choose 3)

- <u>Economic System</u>: What type of economy does Australia have? Show where it would fit on the economic continuum compared to the US.
- <u>Currency</u>: What is it called? What does it look like? What is the US dollar exchange rate?
- <u>Imports/Exports:</u> What does Australia grow or make that they sell to other places (exports)? What are some things it brings in (imports) from other places? What is Australia's main industry?
- <u>Natural Resources:</u> What are they? Where are they located?

## 5. <u>History</u> (all)

- <u>Aborigines:</u> Who are they? Describe their history and culture.
- <u>British Colonization</u>: When/how did the British arrive? What was Australia originally used for? When/how did Australia become a country?
- <u>Impact of Colonization</u>: How did the British arrival affect the Aborigines? How did it affect their rights, health, literacy and language?

## 6. <u>Life in Australia</u> (choose 2)

- <u>Tourist Hot Spot</u>: Choose a place and/or landmark, not previously mentioned in your report and give a deeper look at this particular location and why it would be an important place in Australia.
- <u>Wildlife:</u> Describe several examples of Australian wildlife.
- <u>Natural Events/Disasters</u>: Major natural disasters that frequently affect Australia. Possibly include earthquakes, tornadoes, volcanic eruptions, etc.
- <u>Famous Person</u>: Someone that is well known that either lived/lives in Australia or is from Australia originally. Why are they famous, what's so "great" about them? Include a picture and a summary.
